

CONTINUING EDUCATION FACT SHEET 2010 – HOME INSPECTOR

- Do not submit proof of continuing education (CE) with your renewal.
- You may access the Illinois Home Inspector License Act and Administrative Rules on our Web site at www.idfpr.com/dpr/re/homeinspect.asp

Continuing Education (CE) Hour Requirements

Prior to renewing a license, the licensee shall be required to complete continuing education between December 1, 2008 and November 30, 2010.

- If the home inspector was licensed on or before November 30, 2008, **12** hours of CE is required.
- If the home inspector was licensed between December 1, 2008 and November 30, 2009, **6** hours of CE is required.
- If the home inspector was licensed on or after December 1, 2009, **No** CE is required for this renewal.

Certification of Compliance with Continuing Education Requirements

- 1) Each renewal applicant shall certify, on the renewal application, to full compliance with the CE requirements.
- 2) The Department may require additional evidence demonstrating compliance with the CE requirements. It is the responsibility of each renewal applicant to retain or otherwise produce evidence of such compliance upon request.

CE must be obtained through an IDFPR licensed Home Inspector CE School. The CE course must also have a current license.

Note: CE earned for disciplinary purposes may not be used toward your CE renewal requirements.

Reminder – Any Home Inspector Entity that desires to practice as a home inspector or provide home inspections in the State of Illinois in the form of a corporation, limited liability company or a legally formed partnership shall obtain a Home Inspector Entity License by applying to IDFPR on forms provided by IDFPR and paying the required fee.
