Division of Professional Regulation: *Design Unit*

The Design Unit of the Division of Professional Regulation is responsible for maintaining the public health, safety, and welfare and to be subject to regulation and control in the public interest. Each Profession is governed by its respective Act that merits the confidence of the public, and that only qualified persons shall be authorized to engage in the practice of that profession in the State of Illinois.

The Design Unit oversees the Licensing and Registration for:

- ◆ Architecture
- ◆ Professional Land Surveying
- ◆ Professional Engineering
- ◆ Structural Engineering
- ◆ Professional Design Firm

Did you know?

Illinois licenses Professional Engineers and Structural Engineers separately. There is no overlap of licensure. Each profession has separate and distinct requirements for education, examination and experience.

A Professional Engineer in Illinois cannot offer or perform any Structural Engineering services and a Structural Engineer can only offer Structural Engineering services.

QR Enhanced License Certificates Offer Tech Safeguards

In an effort to increase transparency and provide the public with a quick and easy method to verify the authenticity of a professional's certificate of licensure, the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation (IDFPR) is now including a unique quick response (QR) code for all professions within the Divisions of Professional Regulation and Real Estate. When the QR code is scanned using a QR reader application from any mobile device, the latest license information from IDFPR's database will be displayed, including licensure status. The QR code announcement is the latest from IDFPR in their ongoing efforts to modernize the state's regulatory agency.

"Smartphone technology has revolutionized our lives and how we access information on a daily basis," said Bryan A. Schneider, IDFPR Secretary. "By utilizing the QR code on our certificates of licensure, we afford consumers an easy and efficient way to ensure the validity of our licensed professionals."

All license certificates issued by IDFPR before 7/19/2016 that do not contain the unique QR code are still considered valid. Users can access and print new certificates with a QR code anytime by accessing online eLicense search functionality from the IDFPR website at <https://www.idfpr.com/Applications/GetMyLicense/login.asp>.

Q: What year did Professional Land Surveyors become registered in Illinois?

A: 1937.

The practice of land surveying includes surveying, preparation of boundary descriptions and measuring the area of any portion of the earth's surface.

DESIGN BOARD SPOTLIGHT:

Professional Land Surveyor

We survey the land and ensure you aren't out of bounds.

Professional Land Surveyors are instrumental in performing a variety of services to ensure proper and specific measurements are being listed on project plans as well as listing boundary descriptions, to name a few.

The requirements to become a licensed Professional Land Surveyor in Illinois have changed over the years, however, the heart of what the profession involves remains the same; commitment to excellence, expertise and knowledge. Advancement in examination types and content are routinely updated and modified to better enable applicants to complete the exams in a timely and effective manner so as to start their career as a Professional Land Surveyor.

To that end, The Principles and Practice of Land Surveying (PS) Examination is now a computer-based examination and offered year-round. Examinees may attempt an exam one time per testing window and no more than three times in a 12 month period, which begins with the first exam attempt. Computer-based exams are offered in testing windows during the following months: January-March, April-June, July-September and October-December.

Please note, The Illinois Jurisdictional Examination is currently offered as a paper and pencil exam only. This examination is offered four times a year during the following months: January, April, July and October.

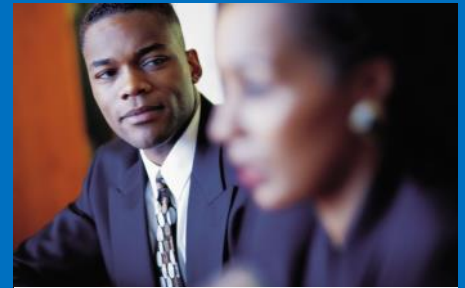
Updated Application Instructions and Forms.

The Department has recently updated the instructions for each of the four Design profession applications. In addition, application instructions for the Professional Design Firm have been updated along with a new Design Firm application.

Candidate Examination Guides have been updated for the Land Surveyor, Professional Engineer and Structural Engineer professions.
