Division of Professional Regulation: *Design Unit*

The Design Unit of the Division of Professional Regulation is responsible for maintaining the public health, safety, and welfare and to be subject to regulation and control in the public interest. Each Profession is governed by its respective Act that merits the confidence of the public, and that only qualified persons shall be authorized to engage in the practice of that profession in the State of Illinois.

The Design Unit oversees the Licensing and Registration for:

- ◆ Architecture
- ◆ Professional Land Surveying
- ◆ Professional Engineering
- ◆ Structural Engineering
- ◆ Professional Design Firm

Did you know?

Illinois licenses Professional Engineers and Structural Engineers separately. There is no overlap of licensure. Each profession has separate and distinct requirements for education, examination and experience.

A Professional Engineer in Illinois cannot offer or perform any Structural Engineering services and a Structural Engineer can only offer Structural Engineering services.

Q: Can a Professional Engineer in Illinois sign/seal Structural Engineering drawings?

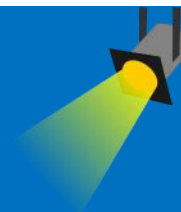
A: No.

Pursuant to Section 5 of the Structural Engineering Practice Act, any project in Illinois that is structural in nature must be signed/sealed by a licensed Structural Engineer.

"Structural" may include but is not limited to: Foundations, Towers, Bridges, Retaining Walls, Load/Seismic calculations, Columns, Girders, etc. all require a licensed Structural Engineer in Illinois.

Structural Engineer



We make sure you're on firm foundation!

As of 2017, Structural Engineers have been licensed in Illinois for **100** years.

While a great number of things have changed over the years; education, experience and examinations to name a few, a core foundation of the law remains. To ensure that suitable and competent individuals are involved with the design and analysis of design that are structural in nature to make certain that the health, safety and welfare of the public are being served.

Illinois is different from many other states and jurisdictions in that a separate law was created to govern the requirements for Structural Engineering. In many other states, a Professional Engineer may perform structural services. In Illinois, only a licensed Structural Engineer may offer or perform structural analysis or design services.

A Professional Engineer in Illinois cannot perform any structural services, doing so is a violation of the Illinois Structural Engineering Practice Act.
