

Home Inspector License Act At A Glance

All home inspectors are required to be licensed by January 1, 2003, including individuals and entities practicing in the form of a corporation, a limited liability company or a legally formed partnership. Please review the Home Inspector License Act (225 ILCS 441) and Administrative Rule (68 Ill. Adm. Code 1440).

Initial License Requirements

- At least 21 years of age
- A high school diploma or equivalent course of study (GED)
- As a pre-requisite to sitting for the examination, an applicant must successfully complete 60 hours of pre-license education from an education provider approved and licensed by DFPR.
- Take and successfully pass a state examination – Examination fee is \$118 payable to our testing vendor, Applied Measurement Professionals, Inc. (AMP). Call AMP at 800/345-6559 to schedule an examination appointment.
- After passing the Home Inspector Examination for Illinois, follow the directions provided on your passing score report/license application. Licensure application materials must be submitted to: AMP, P.O. Box 8496, Springfield, Illinois 62791. (These instructions are contained in the AMP Examination Candidate Handbook).

Renewal Requirements

- Successfully complete the equivalent of 6 hours of continuing education per year or 12 hours per renewal from an education provider approved and licensed by DFPR.
- Complete a renewal application and pay the renewal fee. See fees listed below.

Expiration

- November 30th of even numbered years for home inspectors and entities
- December 31st of odd numbered years for education providers and courses (continuing education and pre-license providers and courses)
