Adrienne Levatino was named the Condominium and Common Interest Community Ombudsperson (“CCIC Ombudsperson”) by Kreg Allison, the Director of the Division of Real Estate (“DRE”) for the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation (“IDFPR”), on January 1, 2017.

As the CCIC Ombudsperson, Ms. Levatino serves as the lead community liaison and educator for condominium and common interest community property issues in the State of Illinois.

Ms. Levatino joined IDFPR in 2015 as the Associate General Counsel for the DRE where she continues to provide legal counsel to the Director of the DRE on issues related to the statutes and administrative regulations governing the seven professions and roughly 80,000 licensees regulated by the DRE.

Prior to joining IDFPR, Adrienne Levatino served as Deputy General Counsel for the Illinois Capital Development Board. Her professional background also includes owning her own public affairs and issues management firm, serving in key roles for corporations and an industry association, and authoring two books and numerous articles on housing and rehabilitation programs. Adrienne is also a former President of the Chicago Chapter of the National Association of Housing and Redevelopment Officials.

Ombudsperson Levatino is licensed to practice law in Illinois and before the United States Supreme Court. She earned her Juris Doctor from the Loyola University of Chicago School of Law and her Bachelor of Arts in Journalism with honors from Northwestern University.
